Latin: A Course for Beginners

This guide will help you decide whether Latin: A Course for Beginners is right for you. It gives you all the essential information you need about the course and studying with NEC. You can also speak to our friendly team (details at the end of this guide) who can advise you.

About this course

Learning Latin, and being able to read literature in the original language it was written in, can be a rewarding and enriching experience.

This course provides a thorough introduction to Latin using a varied selection of extracts and activities. Learning Latin is not easy, and the course requires effort, but by the end you'll have an excellent knowledge of basic Latin, have a strong foundation from which to build valuable language skills, and be able to tackle Latin texts in their original form.

You do not need any previous experience.

This course will enable you to start reading Latin texts from day one - whether you want to read historical or legal documents, decipher memorials or the Latin mass, or simply learn something new.

What's included with the course?

- You will have online access to your course materials through the learn@nec website. You can download and print these, or study on screen.
- You will have tuition from your personal tutor for up to 18 months.
- This course is self contained, so you will not need any additional set texts or resources.
- However, you will also have access to supporting materials, including a Time Planner to help you plan your study timetable, and NEC's guide to study skills: *How to Succeed as an Independent Learner*, plus guidance on spelling, punctuation and grammar.

Your goals and this course

Before deciding to enrol on this course, think about what you want to achieve. For example, you may want to:

- develop your skills in the subject and learn more about it for your own satisfaction and interest
- gain a qualification in order to improve job prospects or go onto further study such as A levels, a vocational qualification or a degree programme

It's important to check that this course will help you to achieve your goals. One way is to research a college where you'd like to study in future or maybe the Open University to find out if this course is part of the entry requirements.

Entry requirements

Completion time

You should allow for between 120 and 150 hours' study time plus additional time for completing assignments. You will have tutor support for a period of up to 18 months from the date you enrol.

Essential textbooks

This course is entirely self-contained so no additional textbooks are required.

However, you may find it helpful to purchase '*Daily Life in Ancient Rome*' by J Carcopino, Penguin, and '*The World of Rome*' by M Grant, Weidenfield, for additional reading. These are not included in your course fee.
